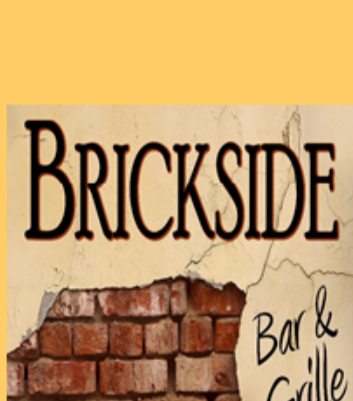


Timeshare Stowe Vermont
