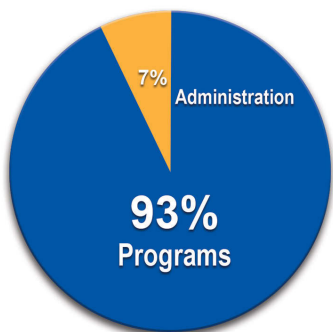

### Forensic Evaluation

### Family Advocacy

Assists non-offending parents and caregivers by providing support, education and referrals to other agencies as needed while remaining focused on the needs of the child.

Provides a safe, child-friendly environment for family visitation in child abuse/neglect cases while cameras and sound equipment allow other parties involved in the case to observe the interaction without obstructing the family dynamics.
